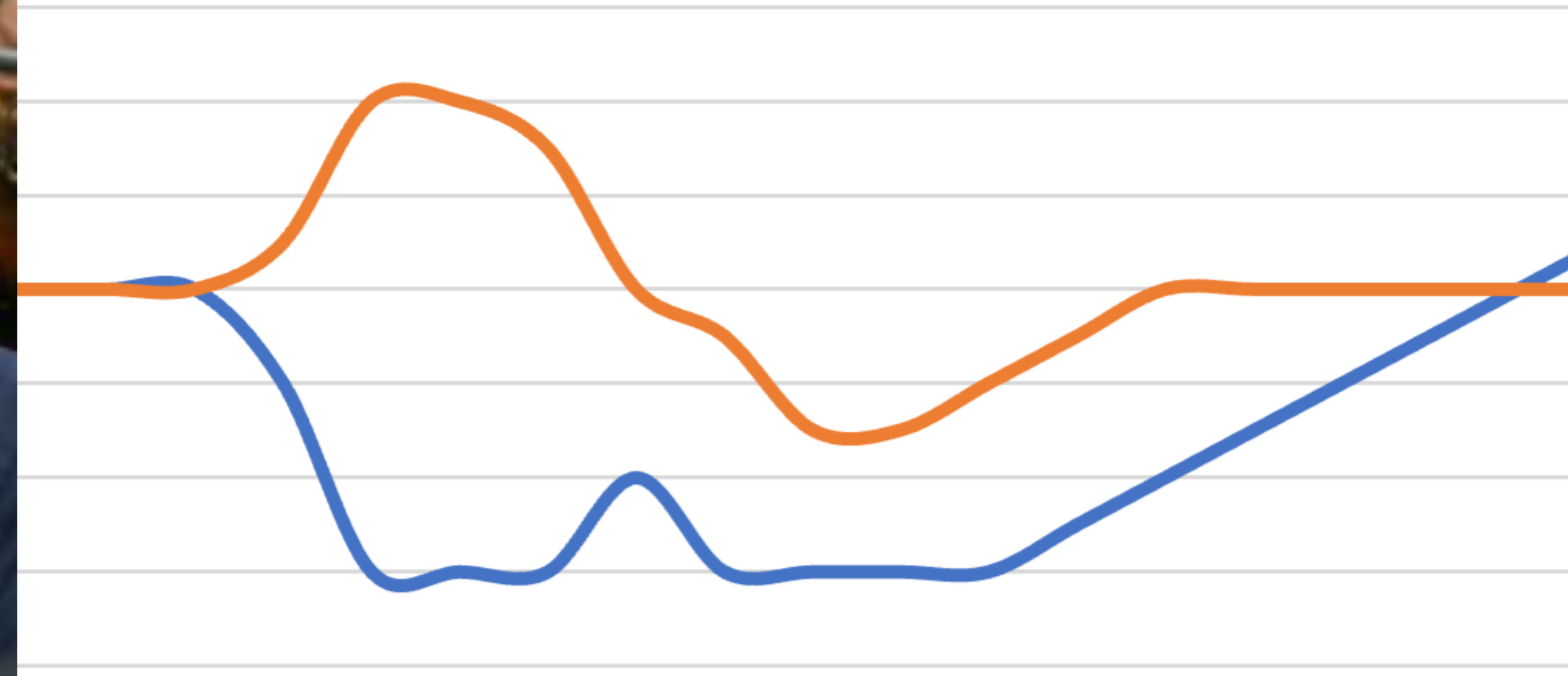

How to measure the capacity to project
oneself in the future?

Qualitative and quantitative measure

- **Qualitative measure:** necessary in order to understand the underlying narratives that allow future projections.
- **Quantitative measure:** necessary in order to compare diachronically and /or synchronically.
- **Causalities:** future projections as dependent or independent variables, and feedback loops.

Why compare future projections in
France and Germany?

Examples of French and German « future matters »

- Defense and Foreign Policy (since the Élysée Treaty of 1963)
- Youth and Education (also since the Élysée Treaty)
- Climate, Energy
- Digitalization
- Measuring French and German futurability on these topics could help to define long-term strategies, better understand the points of dissent or the possible common grounds
